In 1997 he became Senior Partner in the Roythorn office in Boston and bought the office in 2000.

President Bob had been in hospital for a few days since the last meeting and , although he was recovering at home, did not feel fit enough to attend the meeting and PE John agreed to run it.

Dick Denby was our speaker on this day, promising a talk about a friend who had flown bombers in WW2. To ensure a good audience Dick had invited family of the pilot and some distinguished friends including a retired Air Chief Marshall, The Police and Crime Commissioner, the Commandant of RAF Waddington and members of his own family.

Unfortunately as his family gathered at the Denby residence just before lunch Elisabeth had a fall and it was thought had broken her hip. An ambulance was called and Dick left his daughter Victoria and son Peter to support Elisabeth and he came to the event to greet his guests.

It was to Dick's credit that he was able to carry on with speaking after the meal and we were all relieved to see Peter join us to say his mother had been taken in the Ambulance to the Hospital and Victoria was with her.

Dick began by telling us his subject was John Hudson who had made a name for himself by escaping from the Germans after being shot down during a raid in 1943 and he and his crew managed to bail out. Sadly all the crew except John were captured and taken to a POW camp but John managed to contact members of the Resistance and they helped him to escape. The route of his escape was through part of Vichy France, over the Pyrenees and eventually to Gibraltar. This took a long time including time spent working on a farm, but he eventually made it to Gibraltar. It took 3 days for the authorities to accept him as he had no identity papers left. The final test was when the interviewer told him the good news that he had been accepted and told him his sister had just had a baby. This was his final test as he did not have a sister so he made the proper response and was sent home to England.

After the war John joined Albion Motors (originated in Bathgate East Lothian, Scotland and were bought out by Leyland Motors in 1951) began a career which eventually brought him to Bawtry and business with Denby Transport which led to a friendship with Dick.

Proposing the vote of thanks, Terry Coffey reminded us that he was President in 2003/4 and one of his duties was to induct Dick Denby as a new member. He congratulated Dick on his talk, informing us of the experiences of one RAF member during WW11.

We learned later that Elisabeth had an operation and I am sure I speak for the whole Club when I say we wish her well.
