SPEAKER DAWN NIGHTINGALE: Lincoln Community Larder

The Lincoln Community Larder is a registered charity which aims to relieve poverty in the Lincoln area through the provision of basic nutritious food and other basic amenities to those in need of short term help.



Dawn explained that the Community larder works in conjunction with the YMCA, St Giles Church, and various other representatives in surrounding villages. The recent harvest Festival had created a peak in their supplies, but their needs are constant. She drew our attention to a typical sample of 3- days supply of food which she had brought to show us. The current high cost of living is increasing demand and Dawn thanked us for our recent contributions.

She also advised us that there is the Trussell Trust supporting foodbanks nationwide. A needy person must get a Food Voucher from a variety of bodies such as Citizen's Advice, and they can supply and deliver food to them. There is a local Trussell Trust in Birchwood Lincoln. Some foodbanks receive food nearing it's sell-by date from Supermarkets. No cooking is done in most outlets, but there is a group in St Swithin's Church, Lincoln, who supply cooked food for the homeless.

Proposing a vote of Thanks, Dick Denby reminded us that we have all enjoyed a breakfast and a great lunch. It was a privilege to hear Dawn's story and thanked her and her colleagues for serving all those less fortunate.
